MR. COOK'S OFFICE

much slower now. I tried talking to her, but she won't tell me what the problem is.

MR. COOK I'm sorry. But this business can't wait for people who can't adapt to change. You either

produce or you're out. Is that clear, Ms. Cardona?

MR. COOK If Dora doesn't improve by the end of the day tomorrow, you'll have to fire her.

MR. COOK Ms. Cardona, you must fire Dora at once. That's your job. (KNOCK ON DOOR)

Dora enters Mr. Cook's office. Marta is taken aback.

DORA You wanted to see me, Mr. Cook?

MR. COOK Yes, Dora. Have a seat.

MARTA Hi, Dora.

Dora ignores Marta.

DORA You wanted to see me, Mr. Cook?

MR. COOK Well, what are you going to do, Ms. Cardona?

Marta thinks hard. She's about to speak when...

WIZARD	And Freeze! And freeze. Do you think Marta will fire Dora? Before we find out, let's compare these two cookies. If they are the same size, you compare them by saying this cookie is as big as this cookie. I'm saying these cookies are the same size. Let's look at another example.
DORA WIZARD	And I know I'm as good as Helen. This means Dora thinks she works the same as Helen. Now, if the cookies are different sizes, you compare them by saying this cookie is bigger than this one. You add an "er" to the adjective for comparison. Let's look at another example.
MARTA WIZARD	A line worker has an <u>easier</u> job <u>than</u> a manager. Now, to say that one cookie is special and unique, you use superlative adjectives. This cookie is the biggest one. You add "est" to the one that is unique. Let's watch another example.
MARTA MR. COOK WIZARD	For me, talking to the workers is the <u>easiest</u> thing to do. Well, this may be the <u>hardest</u> thing to do Easy, right? Now, let's go back to our story and see what Marta decides. Ready? And action.
	Read, understand and practice
	Comparative Adjectives

Comparative adjectives are the words that help us understand the difference between two or more nouns (persons or things). When we want to say that two things are the same, we use the word "as." For example:

- Marta is <u>as young as</u> Dora.
 - We are saying that Marta and Dora are the <u>same</u> age.

When we want to say that one thing, or person is more or less than the other, we use the comparative form of the adjective plus the word <u>than</u>. For example:

- Bread is <u>cheaper than</u> butter.
 - o <u>Cheaper</u> is the comparative form of the adjective <u>cheap.</u> We are saying that bread costs less and butter costs more.

When we want to say that one thing or person is unique, at the very top, we use the <u>superlative</u> form of adjectives. For example:

- Cornelio is the worst boss of the factory.
 - o <u>The worst</u> is the superlative form of the adjective "bad." We are saying that Cornelio is the ultimate, bad boss.
